

### GETTING STUDENTS THROUGH THE GATE: **THEMED ENGLISH 101 CLASSES**

English 101 is called a "gatekeeper" class because students have to pass it before taking upper-level classes. Our faculty have found a way to make passing through this "gate" more fun and less intimidating: Themed English 101 classes.

English 101 students all learn the same skills. But, when they choose a class based on a topic that interests them-whether it's food, film, or social justice—they're more likely to make it through the gate. And that makes them more likely to graduate.

### COST SAVINGS + INCREASED COMPLETION **OPEN EDUCATIONAL** RESOURCES

Open Educational Resources (OER) replace costly textbooks with open-source teaching materials. TCC instructors save students more than \$1 million per year by teaching with OER.

"Having early, immediate, and free access to OER content has helped TCC students spend less money, start off the quarter with the resources they need, and be successful as they continue their education here," said OER faculty librarian Jennifer Snoek-Brown.

Our students need individualized support to succeed in college. We help them find the types of academic and financial resources they need, piecing together individualized "wrap-around" support. As a metaphor for that support, we decided to make this report resemble a guilt. Like a real quilt, it has two sides. This side features stories of student support leading to student success. The other side details the equally important story of how TCC and the TCC Foundation's finances support students, and gives a snapshot of our campus population.



When Human Services program student Tracie Bonjour received a letter from the TCC Foundation, she hoped she'd been given \$500 or so to help with tuition. When you're raising three kids, working, and going to school, every little bit helps.

Then she opened the letter. And she discovered that she'd been awarded a First Generation Scholarship, which covers the cost of two full years at TCC. It even includes a quarterly \$300 stipend for books.



### NEW ON CAMPUS: **MAX & MARGI HARNED TITAN FOOD PANTRY**

Started as a class project by TCC business program graduates Ashley Ngo and MayLonnai Solie, the Max & Margi Harned Titan Food Pantry is TCC's response to the national and local problem of food insecurity among college students.



### **\$5 RIDE** ALL QUARTER LONG

A new p<mark>artnership between TCC and Pie</mark>rce Transit allows students to buy a \$5 ORCA pass that's good for an entire guarter's worth of rides on all Pierce Transit bus routes.

The program eases the financial burden for students who struggle to afford transportation. Both Pierce Transit and TCC hope it will help build a c<mark>ulture of public transit use in the</mark> Pierce County community.

### FINDING THE FUNDING WORKFORCE HOLLYNN TAYLOR

Hollynn Taylor came to TCC intending to get her GED. She discovered she was eligible for WorkForce, a program that funded not just her tuition, but her childcare and even her parking pass. She quickly completed her high school diploma through the High School 21+ program and is now working toward a Paramedic Certificate and associate degree, funded by WorkForce and a Washington State Opportunity Grant.




### AWARD-WINNING PARTNERSHIP HOUSING HOMELESS STUDENTS

Recognized by the Harvard Kennedy School as one of the Top 25 Innovations in American Government for 2018, the College Housing Assistance Program (CHAP) is a partner<mark>ship between TCC and Tacoma H</mark>ousing Authority (THA) that helps homeless and near-homeless students afford housing.

Results are: • 60% of students in the program stay in school vs. 16% of other housing insecure students

- 3.65 GPA average vs. the overall
- TCC GPA average of 2.97

Dear Friends of Tacoma Community College,






