

PARAMEDIC EDUCATION PROGRAM APPLICATION

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Thank you for your interest in applying to the Paramedic Education Program at Tacoma Community College. The deadline for applications to the Paramedic Education program will be March 31st, annually.

Please submit completed application forms **and** required documentation through the online application. <u>All complete application packets received by the deadline</u> will be carefully screened by the selection committee and considered for attendance at the Paramedic Program Selection Conference.

The selection committee will review all complete applications soon after the application closes. Qualified applicants will be invited to attend the Paramedic Selection Conference, which will be scheduled in either late April or early May. The Paramedic Program Selection Conference will include an information session to explain the expectations of the program and will offer the opportunity for applicants to ask questions.

During the conference, applicants are expected to take the 100 question EMT knowledge written exam, an EMT skills assessment*, and a BLS case presentation. Remember, this is an EMT skills evaluation, and applicants will not be tested on any paramedic level knowledge. Specific directions for the process will be provided to qualified applicants prior to the Paramedic Selection Conference. TCC's Paramedic Education Program is designed to prepare graduates to meet State certification requirements, as well as to take the National Registry EMT-Paramedic examination. Upon successful completion of the Paramedic certificate program, students have the option to pursue an **Associate in Applied Sciences** degree by completing additional credits of general education courses as outlined in the curriculum. Those classes may also be taken prior to beginning the Paramedic Education program. Please see the online college catalog for the most current degree plan.

Checklist for Paramedic Education Program Application Application Deadline: March 31st

To be eligible to apply, candidates must be at least 18 years of age; possess a current EMT certification; have a minimum of one-year of pre-hospital experience working as an EMT prior to the application deadline; be fluent in the English language; and possess the physical abilities and emotional stability to complete the program.

I have completed the Paramedic Education Program Application Form online.

I have included a <u>photocopy</u> of my current <u>State or National EMT certification/card (must include</u> <u>date of issue and EMS Number).</u>

I have included documentation of at least **ONE YEAR** of pre-hospital experience working as an EMT, **ON LETTERHEAD STATIONERY** from the agency(s) where applicant works (or has worked) as an EMT no later than March 31st. This document should include a good faith estimate of the number of patient contacts from a supervisor OR an electronic call log report. Please do not include additional letters of reference or recommendation with your application as they are not factored into the admission process and will not be considered.

I have provided <u>unofficial transcripts</u> from all colleges previously attended (including TCC).

I have submitted documentation that shows **successful completion of the English and Math requirements for admission** through official or unofficial transcripts OR through placement assessment.

Transcript must show: ENGL& 101 **and** MATH& 146 with grade of C or higher.

OR

Equivalent courses as approved by the Program Chair. Course equivalency is not substitution. Substitutions are not likely to be accepted.

I have completed the program course pre-requisites or am currently enrolled in these courses.

HIT 130 Medical Terminology I

BIOL& 175 Human Biology with lab

Pre-requisites should generally be completed no more than 7 years prior to applying. Exceptions may be made if completed as part of a degree that was completed. If pre-requisite courses are not completed before application submission, they must becompleted prior to the start date of the program.
