>>> Turning Passion into Purpose: Malinda's Story of Perseverance and Progress

Malinda's journey to success began as the first in her family to pursue a college degree. After spending eight years as a stay-at-home mom, she dedicated her time to caring for her special needs child and two nieces. It was her experience caring for her son that sparked her passion for healthcare and motivated her to pursue a career where she could help others in similar situations.

When Malinda enrolled at TCC, she knew she was stepping into a new chapter, one that would require personal growth and determination. At TCC, she gained invaluable skills in self-care, time management, and accountability. One of her most impactful experiences was taking the Career and College Pathway Academy (CCPA) class with Professors Allison Muir and Rachelle McGill. This class helped her navigate the personal and academic challenges of college life, giving her the tools to succeed both in and outside of the classroom. Malinda found inspiration in a book from the class, The Practical Neuroscience of Happiness Love and Wisdom by Rick Hanson, particularly a quote that became her guiding principle: "What

Malinda's path was not without its challenges. As a single mother, she faced financial difficulties and struggled with childcare. However, with the help of TCC's Workforce Education program, she was able to overcome these obstacles. The program provided assistance with textbooks and enrolled her youngest child in the Early Learning Center, allowing Malinda to attend classes while ensuring her child was well cared for.

After completing her nursing prerequisites and earning an Allied Healthcare Degree, Malinda's hard work paid off when she was accepted into the Associate's Degree in Nursing program at TCC. She is determined to build a career in healthcare that provides financial stability and the flexibility to spend more time with her children. Her long-term goals include purchasing a wheelchair-accessible van for her son and buying a forever home for her family.

To future students, Malinda offers simple yet powerful advice: don't hesitate to ask questions, seek help, and participate, even when you feel nervous. Confidence comes with knowledge, especially in the healthcare field. She also emphasizes the importance of balancing study time with self-care, suggesting that students take medical terminology before jumping into Anatomy and Physiology classes for greater success.

Malinda's gratitude goes beyond the classroom. She is thankful to her biology professors Curtis Moon, Jonathan Pottle, and Angela Mohanty for their support, as well as her advisor Lauren Crook and Chanry Yann for their compassion. Most importantly, Malinda is forever grateful for the love and encouragement she has received from her family, friends, partner, and children.

Malinda's story is a true testament to perseverance, growth, and the power of community. With her heart set on a career in healthcare and a future filled with promise, she's ready to continue making a difference in the lives of others.

Student can earn the certificate as a stand-alone credential or continue on to complete the full degree. Most certificates take one to three quarters to complete, depending on the program. This flexible approach allows adult students to tailor their education to better reach their career goals.
