Application Dates

Academic Quarter	Priority Dates
Fall	March 1
Winter	November 1
Spring	March 1
Summer	June 1

Applications received after the priority dates will still be accepted, as long as there is still admissions space available. International students are encouraged to apply as early as possible to accommodate the visa processing time. The admission process typically takes four weeks, after all documents have been received by CWU.

Prior College Credits

CWU's academic year is based on quarters. One semester credit is equal to 1.5 quarter credits. Students may transfer up to 135 quarter credits to CWU, with a maximum of 105 credits from lower-division (100-and 200-level) courses.



CWU will accept credits earned at other accredited institutions. Courses that are not exact CWU equivalents may also transfer, but they may only count as general elective credits. Each academic department at CWU has the authority to approve courses from other schools that are not exact CWU equivalents. It is best to communicate directly with your specific department to have those types of course substitutions approved.

Application Requirements

1. Online application form
2. Transcripts
3. Proof of English proficiency
4. Confidential financial statement form
5. Bank statement
6. Copy of passport

To submit proof of English proficiency, international students (except those from Australia, Ireland, New Zealand, the United Kingdom, and English-speaking provinces of Canada) must submit one of the following:

- a) IELTS score (6.0) or TOEFL score (525 for paper-based, 195 for computer-based, 71 for Internet-based)
 - b) A 3.0 or B grade in each of the two college-level English composition classes from a U.S. college or university.
 - c) Recommendation from CWU's UESL program

- Who can apply: Incoming/new international students
 - Award amount: Varies per student depending on GPA
 - Minimum GPA required: 3.0
 - Deadline:

Fall quarter	June 1
Winter quarter	Dec. 1
Spring quarter	Feb. 1
 - How to apply: Simply apply online for undergraduate admissions at www.cwu.edu/admissions/apply-now. No separate form required for the scholarship application. Your GPA will automatically be assessed for scholarship eligibility.
 - Award Notification: Qualified students will be notified via e-mail within a few weeks after they are officially admitted by CWU. Scholarships available while funds last. First-come, first-served basis.
