CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION

BACHELOR'S DEGREE

- 1. Application Form**
 - Complete the International Student Application at www.uwstout.edu/admissions/criteria.cfm
- 2. Application Fee**
 - Submit the \$94 fee payment online with the online application
- 3. English Proficiency (3 options)***
Students can be accepted by:
 - submitting an official TOEFL score (school code 1740) with a minimum iBT score of 61; paper-based score of 500 or an official IELTS score with a minimum score of 5.5. However, students who have composite TOEFL scores below 79 (iBT) or 550 (paper-based) or IELTS 6.5, will be required to take additional English course(s).
 - successfully completing UW-Stout's English as a Second Language Institute
 - successfully completing an English language affiliated program www.uwstout.edu/esl

4. Declaration of Finances

- An official bank statement certifying that either the sponsor or the prospective student has sufficient funds (of at least \$25,000 in U.S. dollars) to insure full payment of expenses for the student's first year

5. Official/Attested Academic Records

- Academic records from all secondary and higher education institutions attended
- Original documents of official/attested academic records, translated into English

** Students with low English proficiency can be considered for conditional admission. If you are interested in conditional admission, please supply all of the above materials except for the English Proficiency requirement.*

MASTER'S DEGREE

- 1. Application Form**
 - Complete the online application at: <https://apply.wisconsin.edu/>
- 2. Application Fee**
 - Submit the \$106 application fee by credit card with online application, or log back in later to submit the fee online
 - Or Mail check or money order made to UW-Stout to the Graduate School
- 3. English Proficiency (5 options)***
 - Submit official TOEFL score (school code 1740) with a minimum iBT score of 70; paper-based score of 523

NOTE: Applicants with TOEFL scores ranging from 70 to 78 are required to take at least one advanced language course through UW-Stout's English as a Second Language program.

- Submit official IELTS score with a minimum score of 6.5
- Successfully complete UW-Stout's English as a Second Language Institute
- Successfully complete an English language affiliated program www.uwstout.edu/esl
- Proof of English proficiency as stated above is not required if you earned a degree within the last 5 years from an accredited institution in the USA or country where English is the **first** official language

4. Declaration of Finances

- An official bank statement certifying that either the sponsor or the prospective student has sufficient funds (of at least \$23,526 in U.S. dollars) to insure full payment of expenses for the student's first year www.uwstout.edu/oie/iss/upload/oie_dof.pdf

5. Official/Attested Academic Records

- Submit official or attested true copies of all academic records from higher education institutions attended along with official English translations (this includes transcripts, marks sheets and degree certificates)

** English proficiency is required. Students working toward English proficiency may be eligible for conditional admission by completing ESL requirements as outlined above and by meeting all degree program application requirements.*

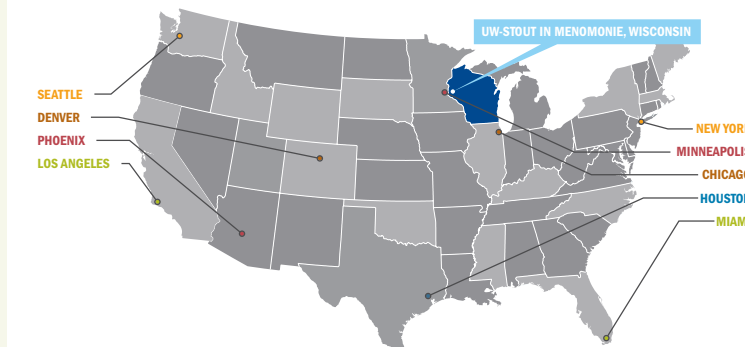

CLIMATE & LOCATION



Located in Menomonie, a safe and friendly small city in the state of Wisconsin, we are close to the large metropolitan area of Minneapolis/St. Paul. Many students fly into the Minneapolis International Airport (MSP) which is only a 1 hour drive to our campus.
