
See your international student advisor to receive your conditional offer of admission!

Known as our Global Partnership, this agreement guarantees admission to Western Washington University for any international student who completes an approved transferable associate's degree from one of our partner community colleges, has a 3.0 or higher cumulative transfer GPA, and demonstrates English proficiency.

English Proficiency is demonstrated with "B" or higher grades in two English composition courses if earning a transferable Washington state Direct Transfer Agreement (DTA) associate degree, an 80 iBT/550 paper-based TOEFL, or 6.5 or higher IELTS score.

Students must meet all other requirements for admission (statement of financial responsibility and proof of sufficient funds, transcripts, official academic credentials, etc.) by the published application deadline.
