Roberts Family Scholarship

Patty McCray-Roberts is living proof that higher education can level the playing field and transform lives. As a first-generation, low-income, Latina high school senior, she had no idea how to be successful, nor her parents' support to attend college. At the time, her family of seven was struggling to survive on less than \$20,000 a year. Her parents didn't have the opportunity to attend college and couldn't understand why she would give up a paying job to move away from home and pursue her education. They felt they could not support her decision to enroll and in fear of the FAFSA process, refused to complete a financial aid application. Patty didn't realize just how difficult college would be without her parents' support. She could never have succeeded without the funding resources that the university's Foundation made available to her and the support of many caring donors along the way. Through that support, Patty persisted to graduation, and her and her children's lives have been transformed beyond her expectations. Today, as a leader, she continues to grow in understanding the challenges and successes of her own educational journey, to better harness those experiences in positive ways. In an increasingly polarized world, it is imperative to her that her personal contributions celebrate diversity, embrace culture, and afford others like her with opportunities to thrive.
