Discussion:

Rachel: Have been teaching LS 102 with Nursing for years; ending that pattern after Winter 2012. Plan to link LS 101 and 102 with English 101 and 102 sections beginning in Spring as a link pilot with a few sections.

Ken: Significant course redesigns in Eng 101 and 102 and 103 -- all these courses will contain a research component; new research assignments will be conducive to linking with LS classes.

Kim: will you encourage all students to take these courses?

Ken: no, will be limited offering this spring, and later depends on load for librarians;

David: we hope in the future that all students can take it.

Char: will you be offering this with other courses?

David: we'd like to, but there are workload issues.

Darlene: if we offer it in conjunction with other courses, can students take it multiple times? David: will need to consider that later

Greg: will students be required to take this – will it mean mandatory 7 credits?

David: no, and not that far down the road yet. We don't know yet how this will impact other classes on campus down the line.

Rachel: what should we put down for prereqs?

Kim: we can leave the prereq blank, and the prereqs will come from the course that these courses are linked with.

David Bahrt: Shuffling/re-ordering classes, rather than adding anything new. Biggest changes are in 121 and 131.

Julie: will correct the plurals in the objectives.

Julie: title in 221 – need to change the title to Acute & Chronic/Complex II Problems. This needs to be repeated in the course outcomes, as well.

Kim & Julie: In short title, add "theory" to the lab classes.

Char: Are min prereqs going to be added – like 111 with min grade of "B" or something? Julie/Kim: doesn't need it – by passing the course before it, they are getting a minimum-

required grade. Motion Carried

Math 093 as a pre-req for some science courses

Motion: Phil Hunter

Phil moves that Math 093 be added as meeting the math prerequisite for

Biol& 100, Biol 105, Biol 108, Biol 125, Biol 140, Biol& 160, Biol& 170, Biol& 175, Bot 101, Envs& 101, Envs 210, Geol& 101, Geol 108, Geol 125, Geol& 208, Ocea& 101, Ocea 179, and Sci 100, and that the wording of the Phys 114, 115, and 116 prerequisites be modified to clarify that Math 136 does not meet their math prerequisite. Second: Dave

Phil: Math dept. recently created Statway courses; SciEng looked at all courses to figure out which courses could use these as prereqs which courses prereqs would need to be changed. Rather that generating all these course proposal forms, presenting one proposal here. The handout lists current prereqs and proposed wording changes.

For Physics 114, 115, 116, just clarifying that prereqs are NOT being updated/added. There is some debate in CHEM about whether this path will be allowed or not; that's why it isn't listed here.

Julie: this will be a big deal for degrees (like pre-nursing): if they take the 93/136 path, they're still going to need to take 146. Students will be confused about whether they can use 136 in place of 146; they cannot. This has already happened to a student (in the nursing advising group).

Char: students who take 146 might think it's higher than 136; since CHEM prereqs say "Math 95 or higher", they'll think 136 is an acceptable prereq.

Phil: Will need to come back to the group (Curric Comm.) about what CHEM decides. Motion carried

6. OTHER Committee Business

a. **Curriculum Committee Manual** – BP (Please Review FINAL DRAFT)

Suggestions have been made by curric comm. members; please make comments or suggestions by 12/15/11. Additions will be made and finalized 12/15/11. It will then be posted on the Portal.

Phil: This manual establishes how curriculum is established; perhaps we'd want to get broader buy-in by taking ideas to IC. Unclear, for example, what happens if we reject a course.

Dave: This is a broader discussion of campus governance

Barb: Our capacity is advisory.

Phil: Involving other groups on campus could result in a broader impact on campus discussions about how curriculum is created and approved.

Barb: At the moment, as a committee, we don't have the ability to make that change. Phil: FF and IC might have the ability to make that change, for example.

Kim: We actually need to finalize the manual (policies, etc.) very soon for accreditation purposes. But we could, at a later date, expand the procedural/campus impact discussion. Kim: making several clarifications to p. 5, "Course Development Procedures," per Phil's suggestions

Phil: also add that if VP disapproves a course, the VP should communicate rationale to the committee and the originator. Kim will add.
