Core of Knowledge (COK)

Demonstrate a basic knowledge of each of the distribution areas (Written Communication, Humanities, Quantitative Skills, Natural Sciences and Social Sciences)and integrate knowledge across disciplines for application in further academic, occupational, civic and personal contexts.

Communication (COM)

Listen, speak, read, write and use nonverbal and technological means to make connections between self and others.

Critical Thinking and Problem Solving (CRT)

Compare, analyze, and evaluate information and ideas.

Information and Information Technology (IIT)

Locate, evaluate, retrieve and ethically use relevant information of appropriate authority and currency for both academic and personal applications.

Living and Working Cooperatively/Valuing Differences (LWC)

Be open to diverse points of view, and draw upon the knowledge and experience of others to collaborate in a multicultural world.

Responsibility & Ethics (RES)

Behave responsibly and ethically toward individuals, the community and the environment.
